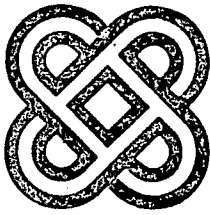

TO: RESIDENTS, TENANTS AND PROPERTY OWNERS ON STATE LINE ROAD FROM
51ST STREET TO 47TH STREET.

The City Transportation Department has been engaged in a study of traffic flow and parking on State Line Road between 39th Street and U.S. 50. As the result of these studies, we have concluded that parking regulations and centerline markings should be installed along State Line Road. The first work is scheduled to be done during the week of September 2, 1977 and will include:

1. Marking of a yellow centerline on State Line Road from 47th Street to 51st Street.
2. Installation of "No Parking Anytime" signs on the east side of State Line Road from 47th Street to 51st Street.
