Don't forget that native plant purchases may be eligible for partial reimbursement through the **<u>BMP</u>** <u>**Cost Share Program**</u>, sponsored by Johnson County Stormwater Management Program and the City. Applications must be approved by the City prior to installation of any plantings to qualify for reimbursement. There is a limited amount of money available, and applications are considered and reimbursed on a first come, first served basis.

Recommended Tree Seminar - September 30, 2020

Dennis Patton, Horticulture Agent at Johnson County K-State Research and Extension, will be the featured speaker at the Prairie Village Tree Board's annual fall seminar being held this year from 7 to 8 p.m., Wednesday, September 30th. The fall seminar this year will be a virtual event.

At the seminar titled 'Recommended Trees', Dennis will discuss trees that would thrive in the Kansas City area.

The virtual seminar is being sponsored by the Prairie Village Tree Board and Johnson County K-State Research and Extension.

Shawnee Mission School District Strategic Bond Plan

The Shawnee Mission School District has spent over a year laying the foundation for a bond issuance to support two pillars of its **2019 Strategic Plan**: supporting educators and quality facilities. Currently, they are working toward a goal to hire additional middle and high school teachers to allow them to teach 5 of 7 periods, as most neighboring districts do. In addition, they are reviewing options to rebuild elementary schools, make significant repairs and improvements in middle and high schools, replace building roofs across the district, and invest millions in HVAC upgrades. These investments would impact dozens of buildings district wide.

As part of this process, a <u>demographic study</u> was prepared, and district staff have laid out an <u>18-year plan</u> to keep pace with identified <u>capital needs</u>. To both hire additional teachers and meet capital improvement needs, a bond issuance would require a tax increase: either now, or a slightly larger increase in five years. These capital needs include a rebuilt Westwood View, although the timing of rebuilding Westwood View would depend on which of these two choices the district makes. Regardless of the path chosen, the Shawnee Mission School District's mill levy would still be significantly lower than any other district in Johnson County.

Any bond issuance must be approved by voters. More information related to the district's capital planning may be found <u>here</u>.
