Snow Ordinance

Please remember not to park on the street during a snow storm and 24 hours after a 2 inch or greater snow so the plows can thoroughly clear the streets.

Violators will be ticketed, and any vehicle remaining on a street 2 hours following a snow accumulation of 2 inches or more may be towed from the street by the city at the expense of the owner of the vehicle.

Thank you for your cooperation in aiding the snow removal.

Illegal Parking in the City

City ordinances limit parking to one side of each of our city streets. Except for 48th Terrace where parking is allowed on the north side of the street, parking is allowed only on the south side of the other east-west city streets. On Glendale, parking is allowed on the east side. Increasingly, passage along city streets is being obstructed by vehicles, including trucks of contractors, which are parked without regard to the parking limitations. This poses a safety hazard at worst and an inconvenience to neighbors at best. Please anticipate enforcement of the city's ordinances and voluntarily comply with the parking limitations.

COVID-19 Vaccine

Johnson County 65+ adults, among others in Phase 2, asked to indicate interest in COVID-19 vaccine....

For planning purposes, JCDHE is asking those in Phase 2 to indicate their interest in getting the COVID-19 vaccine. By completing the survey, individuals will be notified when vaccine becomes available with instructions on how to schedule an appointment. Taking this survey does not create an appointment and does not reserve a vaccine.

Phase 2 groups include:

Persons aged 65 and over Persons (employees and residents) in congregate settings, such as:



- Homeless shelters/homeless housing settings.
- Congregate childcare institutions, adult and child protective services.
- Emergency shelters or safe houses for victims of domestic violence.
- Corrections facilities, including jails and juvenile justice facilities.
- Behavioral Health institutions (including mental health institutions) and residential treatment centers
- Adult care homes, those in home plus facilities not covered in phase 1.
- Senior living homes.
- Personal care aides.

High-contact critical workers, such as:

- First responders, correction officers.
- Grocery store workers and food services.
- K-12 and childcare workers.
- Food processing.
- Large-scale aviation manufacturing plants.
- Transportation workers.
- Workers in the following industries, if they regularly need to be in high-risk settings to perform their duties:
 - Retail, warehouses and sales outlets.
 - Agriculture.

- Supply of critical services or materials for the COVID-19 response.
- The U.S. Postal Service.
- Department of Motor Vehicles.

All unvaccinated persons prioritized in previous phases.
