

Solicitation Permits

Residents have seen a higher number of solicitors in the last month. As a reminder, in Westwood Hills, a permit is needed for most solicitors.

6-303. SOLICITATION PERMITS REQUIRED. All solicitors and companies employing solicitors must register and obtain a permit from the City before soliciting within the City. To obtain a permit to solicit, the applicant must furnish the information required under this article to the city clerk. 6-304. EXCEPTIONS. The provisions of section 6-301 of this article shall not apply to solicitations conducted by charitable, religious, benevolent, fraternal, civic, educational or other eleemosynary organizations and associations.

Stormwater Best Management Practices (Contain the Rain) Program

The City of Westwood Hills encourages homeowners and businesses to incorporate Stormwater Best Management Practices (BMP) on their property to aid in the improvement of local and regional water quality.

The city encourages planting native plants and trees to support the natural ecosystem and provide food for pollinators like bees and butterflies. The BMP Cost Share (Contain the Rain) program will reimburse applicants up to 50% of eligible expenses, not to exceed a project reimbursement cap for the proper installation of the following best management practices:

All projects/plantings must have pre-approval

- Rain Barrel: \$75 per barrel cap, up to two
- Native Plant Garden (must receive runoff) \$1,000
- Native tree planting: \$150 per tree cap, up to two
- Rain Garden/Pollinator Garden: \$1,000 cap

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (**FEMA**) and The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (**NOAA**) are teaming up again to highlight the importance of preparing for severe weather before it strikes. This spring, take time to learn what hazards may impact you, how to take action by making a kit and having a plan, and how you can become an example of where you live by sharing your actions with others, such as friends, neighbors, and co-workers.

Taking preparedness actions can save lives and protect property anywhere - at home, in schools, in your neighborhood, and the workplace.

Learn what hazards pose a risk where you live and work and their potential impact on you, your loved ones, and your community. Once you understand your risk, you are better equipped to make preparations. You can learn more about hazards in your area by going to <u>Ready.gov/Be-Informed</u>. The National Weather Service has a website explaining the basics of severe weather at <u>Weather-Ready Nation</u>.

If instructed by your emergency management officials, create an <u>emergency plan</u> and practice how and where you will evacuate. Post your plan in your home where visitors can see it.
